



## POLICY AND PROCEDURE

**Policy No: 0201**

**Policy Re: High Test Days**

-----

Each Region in the Section must centralize all high tests during the year. The skating year will be divided into three (3) time frames; Qualifying Season (September 1<sup>st</sup> to 30<sup>th</sup>), Winter Season (October 1<sup>st</sup> to March 31<sup>st</sup>), and Off Season (April 1<sup>st</sup> to August 31<sup>st</sup>). A maximum of three (3) high test days are permitted per Region between during the Winter season. High Test Days must be open to all clubs and skaters within the Region.

Regions are required to submit locations and dates for high test days in their region by the deadline date communicated in the Skate Canada – Saskatchewan Test Day Procedures Manual. Late submissions may not be approved.

High Test Days include all Senior Silver and Gold Free Skate, Skating Skills and Dance, Diamond Dances, and all Interpretive tests. Senior Bronze and Junior Silver tests may also be included at the discretion of the assigned Evaluator for the test session.

High Test Days scheduled for the same weekend as Sask Skate, Sectionals, Jean Norman/STARSkate, Saskatchewan Winter Games, or the Section AGM will not be approved.

In accordance with Skate Canada rules, the Section Evaluators/Judges Committee will select Evaluators for all High/Interpretive and Diamond Dance Test Days (Skate Canada Rulebook - Policies and Procedures - Duties of Officials 3.2).

All Clubs and Regions are required to follow the procedures and guidelines as set forth in the Skate Canada – Saskatchewan Test Day Procedures Manual.
