GENERAL INFORMATION

The competition will be conducted in accordance with the regulations as set forth in the Skate Canada Rule Book.

1. EVENTS

The following events are being offered as part of this competition:

Free Skate	STAR 1 to 8
Element Events	STAR 2 to Gold
Team Elements	STAR 2 to Gold
Interpretive	Pre-Introductory to Gold
Creative Improv	1 to 4

Skaters may skate up one level.

Skaters registered in Pre-Novice or higher events at 2019 Sectionals (held in November 2018) may not compete at a Regional Invitational Competition **in the same discipline.** Pre-Juvenile and Juvenile single skaters are eligible to compete in an equivalent STAR event.

2. SYSTEM OF MARKING

Assessed to Standard and CPC Judging will be used for events. Please refer to the Competition Program Requirements and applicable guide on the Skate Canada Info Centre for the complete details.

3. **SCHEDULE OF EVENTS**

Will be e-mailed if an e-mail is provided. Otherwise, a schedule will be mailed to all clubs and coaches who have skaters in the competition as soon as possible after the closing of the entries.

4. **ENTRIES**

Entrants in Events shall be:

- a. Eligible persons as defined in Skate Canada Rule Book.
- b. Be Associate members in good standing of the Association.

Skaters entering multiple events do so with the understanding that there may be conflicts that CANNOT be resolved.

Registration forms **must be completed in FULL and CORRECTLY** or they will not be processed! Ensure the forms are reviewed for accuracy by the Coach and Parent **BEFORE** submitting them to the Host Committee.

Number of events per competitor entered may be limited at the discretion of the Technical Representative and the host committee.

5. **CLOSING DATE OF ENTRIES**

All entries must be received no later than **December 21, 2018**. It is the responsibility of the competitor to ensure that their entry is in to the Host Committee Registration person by the closing date, at their own expense. **ALL TEST QUALIFICATIONS MUST BE PASSED BY CLOSING DATE OF THIS COMPETITION.**

LATE ENTRIES MAY BE ACCEPTED AT THE DISCRETION OF THE TECHNICAL REPRESENTATIVE AND THE HOST COMMITTEE. IF ACCEPTED, WILL BE SUBJECT TO AN ADDITIONAL FEE OF \$25.00.

8. **MUSIC REGISTRATION**

All music used must be in the public domain or covered by the performing rights societies.

Competitors who have music composed especially for their program either wholly or in part, shall be responsible for obtaining a written release from the composer for the use of such music or appropriate clearance from the performing rights societies.

For the information of Dance competitors: 2001 Skate Canada Series 8 music will be used for all pattern dance events.

Music Requirements

- **ALL SKATERS with the exception of STAR 1 must submit an individual CD when they register at the competition.**
- Only CD's will be accepted. Only one program shall be recorded on each CD.
- The start of the music shall be recorded on the CD with less than two seconds of lead in.
- Competitor's name followed by music time (not skating time) shall be clearly printed on one side of the CD.
- Each CD shall be enclosed in its plastic container, also marked with the skater's name, home club, event and total music time.
- Competitors must hand in their music at the registration desk at least one hour prior to the start of their event. The Organizing Committee will accept no responsibility against damage but will take every precaution to safeguard each CD.
- **A backup CD is a requirement of each competitor and should be at rink-side during the skater's performance.**

9. ACCIDENTS

Skate Canada, the host Section/Club and the Local Volunteer Team undertake no responsibility for damages or injuries suffered by skaters. As a condition of and in consideration of their entries in these events, all competitors and their parents or guardians shall be deemed to agree to assume all risks or injuries to the competitor's person and property resulting from, or caused by or connected with, the conduct and management of the competitions and to release any and all claims they may have against the officials, the Association, the Section, the Volunteer Team and against their officers and their entries shall be accepted only on these conditions.

10. REFUNDS

Refunds will be issued for **medical reasons only!** Official notification must be given to Registration in writing before the competitor's Category is scheduled to occur. A medical certificate must be presented to the Host Competition Committee for the refund. Medical certificates must be presented within 48 hours of the close of the Event. A \$25.00 administration fee will be applied to all refunds. No refunds will be issued once a competitor has registered at the Event.

11. REGISTRATION

Skaters must register at least 1 hour prior to their scheduled event but no earlier than 45 minutes before the first event of the day. Music must be turned in at the time of registration. **(2 copies of music must be registered with the copy to remain at rink side)**. Skaters must report to the Ice Captain 30 minutes prior to their scheduled event.

12. FLIGHT SYSTEM

If there is a large number of competitors in an event, a flight system will be used at the discretion of the Technical Representative. Flights may be determined by skater's age and home club.

13. EVENT SPECIFICATIONS

An event at the competition will be held if at least two (2) entries are received for that event. Where applicable, categories of an event may be combined to create an event.

The decision to combine events is at the discretion of the Technical Representative and the Host Committee. If an event is not held due to a lack of competitors, the Host Committee will inform competitors and return entry fees.

14. CANCELLATION OF EVENTS

The host club in consultation with the Technical Representative reserves the right to cancel events.

15. COACH ACCREDITATION

Coaches must be a minimum of Regional Coach Certified and must meet the following accreditation standards:

- a. be a current professional coaching member of Skate Canada in good standing

Coaches must register in person.

16. WARM-UP TIMES

These warm-up times follow Skate Canada rules and may not be altered:

STAR 1 Free Skate	3 minutes
STAR 2 Free Skate & Elements	3 minutes
STAR 3 & 4 Free Skate & Elements	4 minutes
STAR 5 to 8 Free Skate & Elements	5 minutes
Team Elements	3 minutes
Interpretive	4 minutes
Creative Improv	3 minutes

ELEMENT EVENTS

STAR 2 and 3 will be conducted in an Assessment to Standard format.

STAR 4 and higher events will be conducted in an Assessment to Standard with ranking format.

- Once the event is called the skaters will report to the Referee. There is to be no coaching between the elements. Coaches are not allowed on the ice.
- Elements will be skated in the order listed. The first element will be performed by every skater in the event before the second element is performed, and so on until all four elements have been executed by all skaters.
- Each element may only be attempted once.
- Spins will not be assigned levels
- Extra choreography and footwork will not be permitted in this event.
- STAR 2 to STAR 6 events will use half-ice to perform their jumps. STAR 7 to Gold events will use full ice.
- The open category may be used if there are not sufficient entries to run STAR 6 and above categories.

The elements to be skated are as follows:

STAR 2:

- Loop Jump
- Waltz Jump + Toe Loop combination
- Backward Upright Spin Minimum 3 revs E
- Forward spiral sequence: 2 fwd spirals one on each foot performed on either inside or outside edges, no more than 8 steps between both spirals

STAR 3:

- Flip Jump
- Loop + Loop combination
- Combination Spin; forward entry only, must include at least one camel position and one sit position. Change of foot optional, no flying entry, no difficult variations; minimum of 4 revs or minimum 3 revs on each foot if executing change of foot
- Forward Spiral Sequence: two forward spirals one on each foot performed on either inside or outside edges; no more than 4 steps between; both spirals must be unassisted

STAR 4:

- Single Axel
- Lutz + Loop Jump combination
- Combination spin, forward entry only; must include at least one camel position and one sit position; change of foot optional; no flying entry; no difficult variations; minimum of 4 revs or minimum of 3 revs on each foot if executing change of foot
- Forward Spiral Sequence: two forward spirals one on each foot, no more than 4 steps between; both spirals must be unassisted

STAR 5:

- Single Axel
- Jump Combination: two jumps; may include one double
- Combination spin, forward entry only; must include at least one camel position and one sit position; change of foot optional; no flying entry; no difficult variations; minimum of 4 revs or minimum of 3 revs on each foot if executing change of foot
- Forward Spiral Sequence: two forward spirals one on each foot; no more than 4 steps between; at least one spiral must be unsupported

STAR 6:

- Single Axel
- Any Double Jump
- Flying Spin, one position, no change of foot; minimum of 4 revs
- Forward Spiral Sequence: two forward spirals one on each foot; no more than 4 steps between; at least one spiral must be unsupported

STAR 7/8:

- Any Double Jump
- Jump combination: two jumps; the second must be a double
- Spin in one position, no flying entry or change of foot; minimum of 5 revs in the basic position
- Forward Spiral Sequence: two forward spirals one on each foot; no more than 4 steps between; at least one spiral must be unsupported

STAR 9/10:

- Any double jump; double loop or higher
- Jump combination; two jumps, both must be doubles
- Flying spin, one position; change of foot is optional; minimum of 5 revs or minimum of 4 revs on each foot if executing change of foot
- Bonus element: any jump or spin element not already performed

Gold

- Element #1 any double jump - double flip or higher
- Element #2 jump combination – two jumps; both must be doubles
- Element #3 combination spin with flying entry and one change of foot; minimum of five revolutions on each foot
- Element #4 bonus element – any jump or spin element not already performed

Open (STAR 6 or higher)

- Element #1 any double jump
- Element #2 jump combination – two jumps; may include one double
- Element #3 flying spin – one position, no change of foot; minimum of five revolutions
- Element #4 bonus element – any jump or spin element not already performed

INTERPRETIVE EVENTS

Interpretive programs are designed by the skaters and/or coach and focus on the skater's ability to interpret music to create a clear mood/theme or create a story through skating movement. A variety of skating moves should be selected for their value in enhancing the skater's interpretation of the music rather than for their technical difficulty. Movements should not be merely a collection of pleasing or spectacular moves assembled to popular music for the purpose of entertaining an audience (exhibition/show program). Costumes should be simple and modest to enhance the interpretation and should not be theatrical in nature. Props of any kind are not permitted.

Pre-Introductory and Introductory will be assessed to standard.
Bronze, Silver & Gold - CPC Judging System will be used.

Standards are outlined in Appendix A of the Supplementary STARSkate Events Program Requirements & CPC Event Procedures Manual available on the Skate Canada Info Centre.

Skaters must submit the Title of their Interpretive Program at time of Music Registration

Pre-Introductory

Must not have passed any Skate Canada Interpretive Skating test

PROGRAM TIME: One Interpretive Program maximum 2.0 minutes in length

Introductory

May have passed the Introductory Interpretive test but no higher

PROGRAM TIME: One Interpretive Program maximum 2.0 minutes in length

Bronze

May have passed the Bronze Interpretive test but no higher

PROGRAM TIME: One Interpretive Program maximum 3.0 minutes in length

Silver

May have passed the Silver Interpretive test but no higher

PROGRAM TIME: One Interpretive Program maximum 3.0 minutes in length

Gold

May have passed the Gold Interpretive test

PROGRAM TIME: One Interpretive Program maximum 3.0 minutes in length

CREATIVE IMPROV

Creative Improv programs are designed only by the skater with minimal preparation. Creative Improv tests the skater's ability to quickly interpret a given piece of music and entertain the audience.

Creative Improv programs are offered in a singles format and are designed only by the skater with minimal preparation. There is no coaching permitted for these events.

Program length and test requirements for each level of competition are as follows:

Event	Test Prerequisite	Program Time
Creative Improv 1	Skaters may have passed the complete STAR 3 Free Skate test but no higher complete test	Program maximum of 45 seconds in length
Creative Improv 2	Skaters may have passed the complete STAR 5 Free Skate test but no higher than the complete Senior Bronze Free Skate test	Program maximum of 45 seconds in length
Creative Improv 3	Skater may have passed the complete Senior Bronze Freeskate test but no higher than the complete Junior Silver Freeskate test	Program maximum of 1 minute in length
Creative Improv 4	Skater may have passed the complete Junior Silver Freeskate test	Program maximum of 1 minute in length

Program content requirements and event procedures for all levels are as follows:

- all the skaters in a given flight for an event are presented with a pre-selected piece of music by the Technical Representative prior to the warm up. All skaters in the flight for that event will perform to the same musical selection
- skaters will listen to the music twice off-ice in a designated area (i.e. dressing room) and once on-ice during the warm up period
- skaters are then kept in a sound proof dressing room until it is their turn to perform
- simple skating attire is required
- all singles jumps are permitted. Jumps of any higher rotation will be subject to an illegal element violation if included

The panel shall be composed of three judges, one of which will be designated as the Referee. The panel will assess each program in three Program Components: Skating Skills, Performance and Interpretation. Standards are outlined in Appendix A of the Supplementary STARSkate Events Program Requirements & CPC Event Procedures available on the Skate Canada Info Centre.

TEAM ELEMENT

Team Element events are an opportunity for groups of skaters to perform together in a fun atmosphere. Skaters each perform a free skate element to contribute to an overall team assessment. Team Element events consist of progressive levels beginning at STAR 2 up to Gold. Entry for Team Element events is consistent with Free Skate events and teams may skate up one level if they choose. Procedures for Team Elements events:

Team Elements will perform the same elements as listed in the Individual Elements events:

- STAR 2 and 3 assessed to standard
- STAR 4 to Gold assessed to standard with ranking
- Teams must be comprised of a minimum of two and a maximum of four skaters
- More than 50% of the team must have passed the required test for entry (i.e. two of three, or three of four)
- Each skater will perform one element
- If a team consists of less than four skaters, no skater may perform more than two elements
- Elements will be skated in the order listed
- The first element will be performed by every team in the event before the second element is performed, and so on
- Each element may only be attempted once
- Spins will not be assigned levels and will be assessed on quality only
